## NORTH SHORE GUIDE

The 30 miles of rocky coastline north of Boston are punctuated with long sandy beaches, rugged fishing ports, and sparkling sailing harbors. Nautical lore and the ghosts of the witches past offer fascinating glimpses into the region's rich history.

### Suggested Activities:

**The House of the Seven Gables:** For adventure, history and romance, visit the oldest 17<sup>th</sup> century mansion in New England and inspiration for the novel by Nathaniel Hawthorne. The site includes two other 17<sup>th</sup> century houses—one of which was Hawthorne's birthplace.

**Historic waterfront:** Stroll along these nine acres, and stop along the way at 17<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup> century houses and *The Friendship* which is a reconstruction of a 171-foot three-masted Salem East Indiaman built in 1797.

Shop at **Pickering Wharf**, which houses shops and restaurants in the character of 18<sup>th</sup> century wharf-side Salem.

**Marblehead:** Drive through one of the East Coast's premier sailing centers. The historic District is full of 18th- and 19th-century homes of fishermen, merchants, and artisans.

Marblehead also offers some gorgeous ocean properties.



**Whale-watching:** May to October is the season! Vessels from Salem, Gloucester and Newburyport set sail twice a day for individual or group excursions.

**Peabody Essex Museum:** Explore 200 years of extraordinary art, architecture and culture from New England and the world.
